

ITINERARY

Day 1 ~ Tuesday: Relax as we begin our adventure aboard a deluxe motorcoach to experience a wide range of attractions and scenery. Enjoy games, activities and sightseeing while traveling to the first destination, Charlotte, NC, with the **Drury Inn** as home for 2 nights. (D)



Day 2 ~ Wednesday: Visit the **Billy Graham Library** to relive historic moments in the life of one of the most influential voices of the 20th century. Billy Graham impacted the world with his message of God's love, and continues to share it in this inspiring place filled with exhibits, films and memorabilia. Walk through the restored Graham family home, shop in Ruth's Attic, and enjoy lunch in the Dairy Bar.

Later, take a guided bus tour of the city which combines history and comedy while viewing downtown landmarks. Then explore the uniquely designed **Mint Museum**, a 145,000 square foot facility with cutting-edge exhibitions providing unparalleled educational and cultural experiences.

Next, visit **Wells Fargo Museum** with its colorful history of gold mining in North Carolina and the origins of Wachovia Bank, highlighting a rare 19th century Concord stagecoach, a bank branch made from 1889 gold nuggets, a recreated underground mine tunnel and many other interesting artifacts.

Then, take a rest at **The Green**, a charming oasis in the middle of downtown featuring sculptures and signposts based on a world literature theme, as well as fountains, a garden, park benches and restaurants nearby. (B, L)



Day 3 ~ Thursday: Heading toward our next destination, we make a stop at **Campus Martius** in Marietta, OH. Multiple exhibits show the city's pivotal role in the creation of the Northwest Territory, the first expansion of the United States beyond the original 13 states; and includes a tour of the oldest building in Ohio, **The Putnam House**, located *inside* the museum. The ideally positioned **Holiday Inn Express** is our hotel in Cleveland. (B, D)



Day 4 ~ Friday: Bring back fond memories of a holiday classic with a guided tour of "**A Christmas Story**" House, now restored to its movie splendor. Across the street in the museum are the original costumes, props, memorabilia, and hundreds of rare behind-the-scenes photos. Visit the gift shop for unique items such as the famous leg lamp, fun apparel and exclusive ornaments.



Then visit **The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame**, an architecturally stunning building designed by I. M. Pei. Devoted to the story of rock and roll, and alive with the energy, passion and spirit of music. The 150,000 square-foot facility features seven floors, four theaters and ever-changing exhibits documenting the history of rock music and the artists, producers, engineers, and other notable figures who have influenced its development. Small groups of distinguished individuals are inducted into the Hall of Fame annually.



Free time this afternoon allows you to enjoy a variety of sights that suit your interest within easy walking distance from the hotel. Suggestions include: **The Cleveland Public Library** with all it has to offer: art, architecture, history, chess sets and breathtaking views from the rooftop; **The Arcade**, a beautiful Victorian-era marketplace 5 stories high with a skylight spanning over 300 feet; **Heinen's**, a multi-story popular supermarket in a historic bank building featuring a large rotunda with stained glass; or if you're a gambler, visit **Jack Cleveland Casino** located on the public square. ITINERARY



Day 5 ~ Saturday: Before departing the area, tour one of the top attractions the city has to offer, the beautiful **Cleveland Museum of Art**, founded in 1913 "for the benefit of all the people forever." Renowned for the quality and breadth of its collection with over 45,000 objects spanning 6,000 years of achievement. Artists represented by significant works include Botticelli, Dali, Goya, Rubens, El Greco, Matisse, Renoir, Gauguin, Monet, Van Gogh, Picasso, Warhol & more.



Shifting gears on the way to Pittsburgh, visit **The National Packard Museum** and gain valuable insight into what made Packard a great American automobile company. The variety of vehicles, memorabilia and documents reflect Packard's influence on transportation and industrial history through its contributions to present-day vehicle standards for safety, engineering, and luxury.

The **Drury Plaza Downtown** Pittsburgh is home for the next 2 nights. (B, D)

Day 6 ~ Sunday: *The Steel City* offers a wealth of interesting attractions, with included sites listed below, and some which remain a mystery.

Phipps Observatory, a green sanctuary in the middle of Pittsburgh, has provided a world-class garden experience since 1893. Discover breathtaking seasonal flower shows, a nationally recognized orchid collection, butterflies and botanical gardens.



The Nationality Rooms are a collection of 31 classrooms donated by the ethnic groups that helped build Pittsburgh. They are decorated in honor of the culture of the country they represent, and are located in the University of Pittsburgh's *Cathedral of Learning*, a gothic 40-story landmark building erected in the 1920's. The classrooms are still being used to this day during the school year. Most are available to visit during the summer.



The Senator John Heinz History Center features the largest collection of exhibits highlighting over 250 years of Western Pennsylvania historical innovations by companies such as Westinghouse Electric, Heinz Ketchup and Alcoa Aluminum. Pittsburgh is also home to the 1st movie theater, gas station, Ferris wheel, Big Mac, banana split, Bingo game, and so much more. One of the newest and most popular exhibits is *Mister Rogers Neighborhood*. The **Western Pennsylvania Sports Museum**, located within the History Center, celebrates the region's unsurpassed passion for sports and its legacy in football, baseball, hockey and golf.



Point State Park, located at the confluence of three rivers, is at the tip of Pittsburgh's "Golden Triangle." Known for its amazing fountain, as well as its monuments, plaques, and markers throughout the park that commemorate events and people of historic importance at the Forks of the Ohio River.



The Duquesne Incline offers a step back in time on a century-old cable car while riding one of the few remaining inclines in the country. The view from the Observation Deck atop Mt. Washington provides a spectacular panorama of Pittsburgh and its three rivers. The Duquesne Incline's upper station houses a collection of Pittsburgh historic items including photos, and a wealth of information on inclines from around the world. (B, D)



ITINERARY



Day 7 ~ Monday: En-route to Lancaster, a stop will be made at the **Flight 93 National Memorial** in Shanksville to pay our respects to the 40 courageous men and women who sacrificed their lives on 9/11/01, when they made the democratic decision to fight back against terrorism, thwarting a planned attack on our nation's capital and saving the lives of many others. The *Visitor Center* has exhibits that offer a historical look at this special place, and is located behind the *Memorial Walls* which flank the flight path walkway. The *Memorial Groves*, *Memorial Plaza* at the crash site, and *Tower of Voices* are landmark features paying homage to these 40 heroes forever.

Continue the journey to Amish Country and look for differences in their lifestyle as we proceed through the rolling farmland to the lovely **Amishview Inn**. Enjoy a traditional Amish feast served family style this evening. (B, D)

Day 8 ~ Tuesday: A full day of activities await. Discover the warmth and beauty of President James Buchanan's home, **Wheatland**, as costumed tour guides share facts and stories from Buchanan's personal and professional life.

Then visit the **Railroad Museum of Pennsylvania**, home to a world-class collection of more than 100 historic locomotives and railroad cars. Next, steam through scenic Lancaster County aboard **Strasburg Rail Road**. The ride lasts 45-minutes with commentary and a light lunch included in the dining car.

Later, take an **Amish Farmhouse & Village Tour**. Hear about their history and traditions, while learning how Amish have adapted to living in today's era.

Wrap up the day with a live performance of "Britain's Best" at the **American Music Theater**, featuring hits from music greats: The Beatles, Elton John, Adele, Dusty Springfield, The Rolling Stones, Ed Sheeran and more! (B, L, D)

Day 9 ~ Wednesday: Discover **Luray Caverns**, noted for the profuse variety of formations and unsurpassed natural color. Lighted tours on paved walkways lead through cathedral-sized rooms filled with towering stone columns and crystal-clear pools. Experience the haunting sounds of the world's largest musical instrument, The Great Stalacpipe Organ. Also, visit the **Carriage Museum**, **Luray Valley Museum** and **Toy Town Junction**.

The lovely **Historic Brookstown Inn** is our hotel in Winston-Salem. (B, D)

Day 10 ~ Thursday: This morning tour **Reynolda House**, the restored 1917 home of tobacco baron RJ Reynolds and one of America's most authentic examples of a gracious country estate of its time. Enjoy lunch and shopping at **Reynolda Village**, once the dairy barn and cottages of the working estate.

This afternoon, explore **Old Salem Historic District**, a National Historic Landmark founded in 1766 by the Moravians, a Protestant faith that began in the Czech Republic. The town's restored communal buildings, churches, houses, and shops present a view of Moravian life in the 18th and 19th centuries. Skilled living history interpreters practice their trades as tinsmiths, blacksmiths, cobblers, gunsmiths, bakers and carpenters, while interacting with visitors. Approximately 70% of the buildings in the historic district are original, making this a truly unique living history museum. (B, D)

Day 11 ~ Friday: Spend the final day of the tour recalling the unique sights and activities experienced along the way. Lunch is included en-route. Anticipated arrival home is in the early evening. (B, L)
